Open The Conversation: What’s a highlight from your week so far?

Key Scripture: Read the following together. *“But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone.”*

Hebrews 2:9

1. What does this scripture tell me about me?
2. What does this scripture tell me about God?

Start Sharing: Choose one question to start the conversation, move onto others if time allows.

- How do you reconcile the idea of Jesus' suffering with His glory? What does this reality teach us about our own experiences of suffering?
- How does recognizing Jesus as the ultimate authority change the way we approach challenges in our lives and faith?
- In what ways can we ensure that our study of Scripture continually points us back to Jesus rather than just moral teachings or personal improvement? When you read the Bible, how often do you consciously seek to encounter Jesus through the text? What changes can you make to deepen that experience?
- Have you experienced a situation where your suffering led to a deeper understanding of Christ's love or purpose? How did that change your perspective?
- What does true freedom in Christ look like for you? Are there specific burdens you need to lay down at the foot of the cross?

Start Praying: Pray together and for one another.
