

## **Pastor David's Message on Hebrews 6**

**Open The Conversation:** Share something you are thankful for.

**Key Scripture:** Read the following together.

*"We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest forever after the order of Melchizedek."*

*Hebrews 6:19-20 ESV*

1. What does this scripture tell me about me?
2. What does this scripture tell me about God?

**Start Sharing:** Choose one question to start the conversation, move onto others if time allows.

- In the message the speaker said, "In order to glorify God, we have to know Him. Knowing Him is glorifying Him." What does glorifying God mean to you, and how does this statement resonate with you?
- In Hebrews 6:19, we are reminded that "we have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul." What does the hope in Christ mean to you personally, especially in moments of uncertainty or trial? How does this hope serve as an anchor in your life?
- In verses 13-15 of Hebrews 6, the author reflects on God's promise to Abraham and His faithfulness in fulfilling that promise. How does understanding God's covenant promises encourage our own faith?
- Hebrews 6:20 speaks of Jesus as the "forerunner" who has entered the "inner place behind the curtain" on our behalf. What does it mean for Jesus to be our forerunner, and how does His role as High Priest influence our understanding of our access to God? How can this truth impact the way we approach God in prayer and worship?
- Knowing that Jesus has entered the Holy of Holies and secured our hope, how can we live with greater confidence in our relationship with God? What are some practical ways we can remind ourselves and each other of the assurance we have because of Christ's work as our High Priest and anchor of our soul?

**Start Praying:** Pray together and for one another.

*"God, we thank you for our secured hope in you. Help us walk in the reality of you as our High Priest. We long to be near You. Amen."*
