Open The Conversation: Share something good from this week.

Key Scripture: Read the following together.

“Therefore, brethren, having boldness[a] to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh, and having a High Priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.”

Hebrews 10:19-25

1. What does this scripture tell me about me?
2. What does this scripture tell me about God?

Start Sharing: Choose one question to start the conversation, move onto others if time allows.

- Share a testimony of a time you recognized your were not enough in your humanity, and then experienced Jesus being more than enough in your situation/circumstance. What did God show you or speak to you?
- Read Ephesians 2:14-18. What are the "walls" in your life that you feel separate you from a closer relationship with God? How can you remind yourself that Jesus has already broken down those walls through His sacrifice?
- The message talked about the temptation to stay in comfortable spaces and avoid harder truths. How do you approach the “hard” truths in scripture that challenge your worldview or comfortable beliefs?
- The message emphasizes not forsaking the gathering of believers, even when it’s uncomfortable or inconvenient. How can we make more intentional space to meet regularly and build deeper relationships in the body of Christ?

Start Praying: Pray together and for one another.
