

Names of God: Savior

Open The Conversation: If you have free time, how are you using it?

Key Scripture: Read the following together.

3 Jesus answered and said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." 4 Nicodemus said to Him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" 5 Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. 6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. 7 Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.'

John 3:3-7

1. What does this scripture tell me about me?
2. What does this scripture tell me about God?

Start Sharing: Choose one question to start the conversation, move onto others if time allows.

- Where do you still try to “measure up” to God instead of trusting Him as your Savior? In light of Job’s realization and Nicodemus’ struggle, ask the Lord to show you areas where performance, knowledge, or religious effort has replaced dependence on Jesus.
- How have you personally experienced Jesus as your Mediator—someone who stands in the gap for you before a holy God? Reflect on what it means that you no longer plead your own case, but come boldly because of what Christ has done.
- What evidence of a “new heart” do you see in your life—and where do you need fresh surrender to the saving work of God? Consider desires, convictions, or changes that point to being born-again and invite God to continue His transforming work.
- Job recognized his need for a mediator, and Nicodemus discovered his need for new birth. What do these stories teach us about why we need God as Savior—not just God as teacher or judge? How does this reshape the way we understand salvation?
- The Bible presents God as Savior who gives a new heart and places His Spirit within us. How is this different from a rule-based or performance-based faith, and

why is this good news for all of us? What freedom does this bring into our daily walk with God?

Start Praying: Pray together and for one another.
