

## Names of God: The Faithful One

**Open The Conversation:** Share something good from the previous two weeks.

**Key Scripture:** Read the following together.

*11 And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death. 12 Therefore rejoice, O heavens, and you who dwell in them! Woe to the inhabitants of the earth and the sea! For the devil has come down to you, having great wrath, because he knows that he has a short time."*

*Revelation 12:11-12*

1. What does this scripture tell me about me?
2. What does this scripture tell me about God?

**Start Sharing:** Choose one question to start the conversation, move onto others if time allows.

- Where in your life right now do you need to trust God as the Faithful One—especially in something that feels dark, delayed, or uncertain? (Like Abraham, is there something I'm holding tightly that God is inviting me to trust Him with?)
- Have fear, doubt, or insecurity been keeping your mouth shut about what God has done in your life? What would it look like for me to share my testimony more boldly?
- What does it practically mean to overcome "by the blood of the Lamb and the word of our testimony" in everyday life? How have you seen testimony strengthen your faith or someone else's?
- Why do you think people often avoid bold faith (praying publicly, sharing the gospel, laying hands on the sick)? How can we encourage one another to walk in confidence instead of fear?
- God's will is described as good, acceptable, and perfect (Romans 12:1–2). What are some ways culture pressures us to conform instead of trusting God's faithful character?

**Start Praying:** Pray together and for one another.

*"Father God, we thank you for being faithful to us! Help us to trust you in the dark moments, because we know you are faithful. Help us walk in boldness so all may taste and see how good and faithful you are! Amen."*
