

Names of God: The Lord Will Provide

Open The Conversation: What's the best thing to do in spring?

Key Scripture: Read the following together.

1 Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 2 Then He said, "Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." 3 So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son; and he split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him.

Genesis 22:1-3

1. What does this scripture tell me about me?
2. What does this scripture tell me about God?

Start Sharing: Choose one question to start the conversation, move onto others if time allows.

- Where are you currently asking, "God, will You come through for me?" What situation in your life feels like Abraham's "three-day journey," where you're walking in obedience but still don't see the outcome?
- What "Isaac" might God be asking you to trust Him with? Is there something (a relationship, dream, identity, or outcome) that you're holding tightly, and God is inviting you to surrender?
- Do you believe God will provide something—or that He will provide Himself? How would your anxiety, prayers, or expectations shift if you truly saw God Himself as your ultimate provision?
- Why do you think God allowed Abraham to go all the way up the mountain before providing the ram? What does this teach us about timing, trust, and how God works in our lives?
- The message emphasized that "God sees" before He provides. How have you experienced (or struggled to experience) the idea that God already knows and has prepared for your needs?
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Start Praying: Pray together and for one another.

"Father, you are my provision! I declare and believe everything I need is in You, You are all I need. Help me see and receive this reality in You every day. I love you Lord! Amen."
