

Names of God: Infinite One

Open The Conversation: What's your favorite treat/candy to eat around Easter time?

Key Scripture: Read the following together.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.

John 1:1-3

1. What does this scripture tell me about me?
2. What does this scripture tell me about God?

Start Sharing: Choose one question to start the conversation, move onto others if time allows.

- Where do you tend to measure your worth by your performance instead of by what God has already declared about you? (Reflect on the contrast between your internal “voice” and the truth presented in passages like Ephesians 2:10.)
- What does it personally mean to you that the “Infinite One” chose to die—and rise again—for you? (Not just as a general truth, but applied specifically to your life story, struggles, and identity.)
- In what areas of your life do I still live as if the resurrection hasn't already declared “it is finished”? (Think about guilt, shame, fear, or striving that may contradict the truth of justification in Romans 4:25.)
- Why do you think it's hard for people to truly believe they are of “infinite worth” to God? What are some common misconceptions or barriers that keep people from accepting this?
- The parable of the lost sheep (Luke 15:3–7) shows a “reckless” kind of love—what does that look like in how we treat others? How can we reflect that same pursuit and value toward people in our own lives?

Start Praying: Pray together and for one another.

“Father, open my eyes to see me how you see me. Today I choose to pursue an intimate relationship with You. Thank You for loving me recklessly. Amen.”
